Takeaways:

- Creating Teams went really well given we had 102 kids this season (17 per team)
- We assigned equal amount of "A" players and "B" players on each team so we could run two half ice games each week that weren't lopsided
 - o I ranked each player in the evaluation skates 1,2 or 3 (1 advanced, 3 Novice)
 - Worked through friend requests and came up with 6 competitive teams
- Getting Coaches on the same page started out really well and for the most part sustained. The hard part here is a lot of times the coaches' kids are the better players and they get the itch to try and make the program more like a travel team and move away from the rec league, skill development model we have set up.
- Practice plans I felt were great and we can probably create a folder for each practice done this season since they were all typed out.
 - Had a rotation that one coach each week was responsible for creating the practice plans for every team so everyone was on the same page prior to hitting the ice. If no zam was done stations were already ready to roll adding to ice time
- Games went well with half ice games, equal teams and equal skillsets playing each other
 - Last month we flipped to full ice (Hockey Rules) with refs which went really well.
 - Teams played non conference games and each team played two tournaments
 - One team entered state tournament
- Select Team (Barracuda's) was an awesome addition and should be continued
 - They played a handful of scrimmage games and two tournaments
 - o Players were selected by the coaches from watching the first month of the season instead of a tryout.
- Jamboree's went smooth, had a few minor compliments but overall kids had a blast and they were a great celebration of the season
- Equipment upgrades of new goalie gear, new nets, new divider pads all played a huge role this season in making things run smooth.
 - Full puck bags kept disappearing need to put in a fix in for that
